<u>Description</u>: The County Engineer/Public Works Director performs administrative and professional engineering work in planning and directing activities of the County Engineering and Public Works Department for Mobile County, Alabama.

<u>Minimum Qualification Requirements</u>: Attainment of a minimum of a bachelor's degree from a recognized college or university in civil engineering, preferably a master's degree, and a minimum of five years responsible engineering experience in the management of a governmental public works department at the level of an Assistant County Engineer; or a combination of education and experience equivalent to these requirements.

<u>Special Requirement</u>: Registration as a Professional Engineer by the State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors in the State of Alabama. Applicants licensed as a Professional Engineer by another state will be required to obtain Alabama Professional Engineer licensure soon after appointment.
