Session Topics 2014 Safety Coordinator Training

This year's Safety coordinator training will include segments on loss reduction and loss prevention. If you want to express it as a football analogy, loss prevention is our offense and loss reduction is our defense. Training sessions will offer *practical advice* that safety coordinators can take home and start using.

Injury Management

This session will address how to build the best defense by teaching *practical* injury management. Given enough time, injuries are going to happen no matter how much we do to prevent them, so be should be prepared. Whether you are dealing with a minor injury like a cut finger or a severe injury like a fractured leg, injuries require proper management. Training will take safety coordinators through the steps that mitigate injury costs and help return an injured employee back to the county as a productive employee. Behavior Based Safety

This session will address the *practical ways* of reducing the likelihood of accidents. Training will offer an introduction to behavior based safety by showing how its concepts are implemented to encourage safe behaviors. Who wants to labor away without results?
