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PREFACE

The Comparative Data on Alabama Counties: Part 1 report is based primarily on responses to a survey conducted in 2022 by the Association of County Commissions of Alabama. This publication represents the actual responses of the counties. It offers an overview of county government in Alabama and how the 67 counties compare in a host of important areas. This report will serve as the first in a series of comparative data documents to come.

As with any survey publication, the accuracy of the information cannot be certified by the Association of County Commissions of Alabama. The responses in this publication are presented as recorded in the survey. Additionally, the information contained herein may have changed between the time the survey was conducted and published. Moreover, the contents of this publication are organized in chart form so that comparisons can be made easily and quickly. A key has been introduced at the bottom of charts where an array of responses was available to provide additional clarity and improve readability.

Every effort was made to obtain all information from every county. However, some counties chose not to respond to the survey. As a result, readers will notice instances where no information appears beside a county name.
