



NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS
SOUTHEAST REGION (TROY AREA) JOINT BID FOR THE PLACE
FURISHING AND PLACEMENT OF TRAFFIC STRIPE, MARKINGS,
LEGENDS, AND PAVEMENT MARKERS

This bid is intended to comply with the Rebuild Alabama Act, No. 2019-2, and Alabama Code Title 39, of the Alabama Public Works Law. Bidders shall be required to comply with the provisions of the Rebuild Alabama Act, No. 2019-2 and Title 39 of the Alabama Code regardless if the requirement is explicitly detailed in the bid proposal or not.

Sealed bids will be received by the Coffee County Commission at the Office Complex in New Brockton, Alabama, until 10:00 A.M., June 18, 2025, and at that time publicly open for constructing the following:

Annual bid for supplying and placement of Traffic Striping, Traffic Markings, Traffic Legends and Pavement Markers on various county roads within the nine counties located in the Alabama Department of Transportation's Troy Area (Barbour, Coffee, Covington, Crenshaw, Dale, Geneva, Henry, Houston and Pike Counties).

The contract period shall be for 12-months with an option to issue a second and third 12-month contract under the same pricing, terms and conditions.

A certified check or bid bond payable to the Coffee County Commission for an amount of 5% of bid (maximum - \$10,000) must accompany each bid as evidence of good faith.

Specifications and Proposals may be obtained at the Coffee County Engineer's Office, 1165 East McKinnon Street, New Brockton, Alabama from 6:30 A.M. until 5:00 P.M., Monday through Thursday (telephone 334-894-6112). No proposal fee is required.

The bidder's proposal must be submitted on the complete original proposal furnished him by the Coffee County Commission. Bids will be received only from contractors duly licensed by the State Licensing Board for General Contractors.

This project will be eligible for a Certificate of Exemption as provided by Act 2021-372. Once a proceed order is issued, the contractor shall have 5 days to submit the Form ST-EXC 1 to the County.

The right to reject any or all bids is reserved.
